## From Our Rabbi



"Every creature is better alive than dead, men and moose and pine trees, and he who understands it aright will rather preserve its life than destroy it." ~ Henry David Thoreau

This February 6th, 2023 (beginning on the evening of the 5th), we celebrate *Tu B'Shvat*, the holiday referred to as the "New Year of the **Trees**" or, in Hebrew, *Rosh HaShanah La'llanot*. Named after the Hebrew date it occurs (15 is Tu, of the month of Shevat), *Tu B'Shvat* is, today, (especially in Israel) celebrated as an ecological awareness day and **trees** are planted in celebration.

The Midrash on Ecclesiastes, Kohelet Rabbah 7, explains: "When the Blessed Holy One created the first human, G-d took him and led him around all the trees of the Garden of Eden and said to him: 'Look at My works, how beautiful and praiseworthy they are! And all that I have created, it was for you that I created it. **Pay attention that you do not corrupt and destroy My world**: if you corrupt it, there is no one to repair it after you."

According to the organization, One Tree Planted, "trees help clean the air we breathe, filter the water we drink, and provide habitat to over 80% of the world's terrestrial biodiversity. Forests provide jobs to over 1.6 billion people, absorb harmful carbon from the atmosphere, and are key ingredients in 25% of all medicines." They further proclaim that "46% of the world's forests are already destroyed, 46-58 thousand square miles of forest are lost every year, 80,000 acres of forests disappear from the Earth every day - that's the equivalent to 48 football fields every minute or one football field area of forest per 1.2 seconds." Forestry Specialist, Ross Bernet, calculated that "the average

tree absorbs an average of 10 kilograms, or 22 pounds, of carbon dioxide per year." He further argues: "It's important to remember that the true benefits of **trees** and healthy forests go far beyond carbon storage. Their value for biodiversity, social impact, and the stability of the global climate are well documented. This may also be a challenge to measure, but at the end of the day the need to protect and restore our forests by **planting trees** is essential."



Judaism had always recognized the importance of **Trees** and the Environment. This core value runs deeply within the Jewish DNA. Today, we see proven results, statistics and modern developments that should make us proud of our People. "Israel is one of the only nations in the world that entered the 21st century **with more trees** than it had 100 years ago. Since its inception, Israel has been devoted to sustainable forest management and afforestation, planting trees mostly in areas with arid and semi-arid climates. JNF was founded in 1901 to purchase land for Jewish agricultural communities, as well as to carry out development, reclamation and afforestation projects in the Land of Israel. By the time Israel became independent in 1948, JNF had planted about 4.5 million trees on the country's rocky hillsides. Today, over 200 million trees in forests and woodlands covering some 300,000 acres provide Israelis with a wide range of opportunities for outdoor recreation and appreciation of nature." (source: embassies.gov.il)

Fueling some more Jewish Pride, an article on RootsOfRedemption.org lists the "7 Agricultural Technologies that make Israel one of the leading forces in the Agriculture world" as:

"Drip Irrigation - A system which drips water directly into plant roots. It significantly reduces water and increases crop yields.

*Recycled Water* - Israel recycles over 86 percent of its waste water. This is by far the highest in the world.

Intelligence - Taranis is an intelligence platform that uses satellite imagery, aerial footage, big data, and predictive analytics to monitor fields and help farmers make the best decisions. Farmers can image a field in a super high resolution – about 0.1 millimeter per pixel. That means that we can see a tiny insect on a leaf, and then we can train a computer to analyze it to find these insects. It can also find weeds and give a farmer a report allowing the farmer to spray accordingly.

*Biopesticides* - IOB uses predatory wasps to control insects as a bio pesticide. This reduces the need for chemical pesticides by up to 70%.

Biofertilizers - Growndwork Bio AG uses tiny microscopic fungi to help plant roots absorb more nutrients. This increases crop yield with less fertilizer so the fungus penetrates the plant root. The plant roots are then extended in an underground web. The fungus can break down nutrients that are otherwise unavailable to the plant and physically mobilize them into the plant root system.

Robotics - FF robotics makes robots with computer vision that can actually pick fruit straight off the trees.

Sensors - SupPlant uses data and sensors to talk with plants to know exactly what nutrients they need and when they need to be watered."

Anthropologist, Margaret Mead, said: "Never doubt that a small group of thoughtful, committed citizens can change the world; indeed, it's the only thing that ever has." Our Torah teaches us that we have a responsibility to protect this planet and to help our environment flourish. Genesis 2:15: "G-d took Man and placed him in the Garden of Eden, **to work it and guard it."** Then, later, the Torah states, in Deuteronomy 20:19: "When (even) in war... you must not destroy **trees**... You may eat of them, but you must **not cut them down**." *Tu B'Shvat* is a day that reminds us of our responsibility and asks us to reconnect to Nature. Traditionally, we celebrate by eating new fruits, primarily those varieties grown in the Land of Israel. This year, we may consider celebrating by planting a new **tree**. A great new project worth supporting this year is www.RootsbofRedemption.org, bringing growth to the Hills of Judea. May Hashem grant humanity the ability to bring our Planet back to being the Garden of Eden; and, may we witness that Great Glory and Beauty within our days!


This year there has been a rise in anti-Semitic attacks on Jews. This is an alarming fact. There appears to be little pause in the hatred. Just recently Kayne West's stream of antisemitism, those who agreed with him were not deterred by his cancellation from Nike. They hung banners over the 405 freeway in Los Angeles proclaiming, "Kanye is right about the Jews." People on the overpass appeared to make the "Heil Hitler" gesture with their outstretched arms. In Jacksonville, Florida, the same message crawled across the outside of the stadium hosting the Georgia-Florida college football game and across a building in the city. Banners hung over Interstate 10 in Jacksonville read, "End Jewish Supremacy in America" and "Honk if you know it's the Jews." All of this is arriving around the fourth anniversary of the Tree of Life shooting, the deadliest attack on the Jewish community in US history. To quote Rabbi Myers from Tree of Life Synagogue where I was a member growing up in Pittsburgh:

"It cannot fall on Jewish people alone to fight these acts of hate, victims are not the ones to cure antisemitism, it's the place in which it's grown that it must be cured. So, in the case of America, America has permitted antisemitism to grow unabated over a very long time. ... We have to turn to the remainder of America, and say, America, look what's happening. Look at the rot from your core. You have to fix that, because this is just the beginning. It doesn't end with antisemitism. ... From antisemitism, it moves on to another minority group and another minority group until there's no one left to call out because all of the groups are no longer around."

As 2022 comes to an end, we at TBJ will continue to think about our accomplishments, as well as those of our family members and friends. We remember special moments that made us particularly happy or proud. As your Co- President, I've seen the dedication and selfless work of many congregants. I want to personally thank all you who have committed your time and effort for the benefit the TBJ community. Thank you to TBJ Board members, our committee members, Women's League and the many members who have made generous donations of both money and time throughout the year. 


