From Our Rabbi

"Birthdays are good for you. Statistics show that the people who have the most live the longest." - Larry Lorenzoni

Do you know what, according to the 1998 Guinness Book of World Records, is the most recognized song in the English language? In 1893, the Hill sisters, one a kindergarten principal, wrote an easy song for young children to sing. "Good Morning to All," never quite hit the charts until those words were changed in the early 20th Century to more famous ones. Have you guessed it yet?

I'd bet there isn't a day that goes by that the song "Happy Birthday To You" isn't sung to someone, somewhere in this country. Those famous words speak of a tradition whose origin is hard to pinpoint. We know that Pharaoh celebrated his birthday, as the Torah relates in Genesis 40:20. There are records that birthdays were celebrated in ancient Rome, and throughout Pagan times more than 2000 years ago. The belief was that celebrating one's birthday would ward off evil spirits. People would gather to spread cheer and good wishes, and make noise to scare the evil spirits away. Some even believe that the Birthday Cake and candles were to symbolize the Goddess of the Moon.

Despite such *unorthodox* origins, many Rabbis throughout history encouraged Jews to celebrate their birthdays as a way of praising G-d. The late Lubavitcher Rebbe, Rabbi Menachem Mendel Schneerson, encouraged celebrating one's birthday as a means of inspiring appreciation. He explained that "the source of the happiness of a birthday is the celebration of the essence of one's existence and represents the renewal of one's life in the same way that G-d renews a person's soul every morning. Thus, just as one thanks G-d every morning for this renewal, one should also thank G-d every year for the gift of life." (*Toras Menachem 5748, vol. 3, pg.* (152)

The Talmud (*Pesachim 68b*) teaches us that we still have something to celebrate on the holiday of Shavuot, even after the destruction of the Holy Temple in Jerusalem. Rabbi Eleazar reminds us that Shavuot is the Birthday of the Torah; the day we celebrate the Revelation at Sinai. On Shavuot, many celebrate by staying up all night, learning the Torah and commentaries, as a sign of our love and appreciation.

Celebrating Shavuot proclaims just how central, holy, and important the Torah is to us!

Shavuot 5783 begins on Thursday evening, May 25, 2023. Rachel and I invite you to celebrate the Torah's Birthday with us at our house. The Party, *Tikkun Leil Shavuot*, will be from 7-9pm and will include Torah study and discussion, friendship and community, and, of course, *Cheesecake!* Please, remember to call the office to *RSVP* and ask for our new address. Message from our President



Passover this year was terrific for Sallee and me.

This Pesach we travelled to Israel, not only to see some sites that we had never seen before but, more importantly, to see our large Israeli family. Its been 4 years since we returned because of Covid. This visit was very rewarding. The first week we spent at Kibbutz Tirat Zvi https://www.kibbutzvisit.com/listing/kibbutz-tirat-zvi/ This is where Sallee's sister has lived for 47 years. This is a modern Orthodox Kibbutz. There are approximately 400 families who live, work and play on this Kibbutz. The main source of income is their meat factory, but they also export fish and dates. I pretend to be Orthodox when I'm there. The male dress code is easy; dark pants and a white shirt on Holidays and Shabbat. This year I was smarter than in the past. I brought Siddur Sim Shalom (prayer book) that we use at TBJ so I could follow, even though the entire service is in Hebrew. Pesach services were very good. I sat with the brother-in-law and my nephews. Sallee was with her sister and nieces in the ladies' section. In Israel, there is only one Passover Seder and there were 22 of us in attendance. Our Israel family is too large for everyone to come visit at one time, but we were very lucky this year. We were able to visit and eat with each family separately at least twice. We have 7 nieces and nephews. Their families make up 33 children, or in Sallee's sister and my brother's-in-law case; they have 33 grandchildren. All I did for the week in Kibbutz was eat, pray and visit. Barbra Shmueli (Sallee's sister) arranged for everyone to meet on the following Sunday in Jerusalem at a park for a picnic. All the families brought food so you can imagine how much food there was. We had a wonderful time. We spent the rest of Chol Hamoed (Passover week) and the final day of Pesach in Jerusalem.

The last day of Passover and Yizkor we went to the USCJ Fuchsberg Synagogue https://fuchsbergcenter.org/ which was walking distance from our hotel. They used the same books, Siddur Sim Shalom and Etz Chaim, as we use at TBJ and I was able to follow perfectly. Most of the tunes were the same and very enjoyable and the sermon was in English! We went on two most memorable tours; the NEW Kotel Tunnel and Bullet factory tours. The new Kotel Tunnels tour at the Western Wall of the Temple Mount was fascinating. Also known as the "Jerusalem Wall" it is one of the most magnificent and significant remnants in Jerusalem from the days of the Second Temple, destroyed approximately 2,000 years ago. https://thekotel.org/en/tours/western-wall-tunnels/.

We also went on the legendary Bullet Factory Tour. Adjacent to the Science Park in Rehovot, on Givat Kibbutzim, is the Ayalon Institute which tells one of the fascinating and mysterious chapters in the history of the struggle for the establishment of the State of Israel. Here, underground and right under the noses of the British, they established a factory for the production of 9mm bullets for the Sten submachine gun, which was the personal weapon of the Palmach fighters. The plant is 26 feet underground and the size of a tennis court. https://shimur.org/sites/ayalon/. If you haven't been to Israel, it's a must.

Hoping that in the future a Temple B'nai Tour can happen.
