From Our Rabbi

The Eighth Night: When the Miracles Become Habit

"We are what we repeatedly do. Excellence, then, is not an act but a habit."— Aristotle Most of us love the first night of Chanukah. There's something magical about that initial spark — new candles, the first blessing, kids gathered around, that familiar tune of Maoz Tzur. However, if you think about it, the real test of Chanukah isn't the first night — it's the eighth.

The first night is exciting. By the eighth, we've already cleaned up the wax eight times, eaten our fill of latkes and jelly donuts, and sung the same songs many times. The eighth night is where the miracle meets the mundane. That's when the question becomes: Can I still find wonder in something I've already done seven times before?

That's where the deeper message of Chanukah shines. The Talmud teaches (Shabbat 21b) that we don't light all the candles at once. We add one each night. The light doesn't explode—it builds. In other words, holiness grows slowly, like a muscle strengthened by repetition.

Modern author and habits expert James Clear, in his bestselling book Atomic Habits, puts it this way: "Every action you take is a vote for the type of person you wish to become." Therefore, each time we light the menorah, we're casting another "vote" for the kind of person we want to be — someone who brings more light into the world, even when it feels mundane.

There's a beautiful chassidic insight from the Sfat Emet (Rabbi Yehudah Aryeh Leib Alter of Ger) that every day of Chanukah reveals a new hidden light, one that wasn't visible before. Even if the act looks the same — the same flame, the same blessing — the soul of the moment changes, because we change. That's what makes the eighth night so special. It's not just the brightest menorah — it's the night that proves we kept showing up. That's not routine, that's growth.

So this year, when you light the last candle, take a moment to notice how your light has expanded — not in one grand miracle, but in eight small, steady steps. That's the kind of miracle we can all carry into the rest of the year.





