## From Our Rabbi

Never, ever underestimate the importance of having fun." ~ Randy Pausch ~

I have a confession to make ... I may be addicted to apples! I love, love apples, apples of all kinds, red, yellow, or green, and every shade in between. If I was told I can only eat one food for the rest of my life – I'd choose to eat apples. The truth is, I probably eat, on average, about three apples per day, and I'm always on the hunt for a new variety to try. Another vice is that I love to eat honey. So, essentially, I make the perfect Rosh Hashanah Jew!

We all remember that we dip the apple in the honey for a sweet new year. However, did you know that there are 7500 different apple varieties, and 300 different types of honey worldwide? If we were to follow in the footsteps of Tablet Magazine's article, September 2009," Comparing Apples to Apples: Dipping apples in honey for Rosh Hashanah? Here's a guide to picking the best ingredients for a sweet new year," we would have over 2 million combination choices to taste-test. In particular, I want to call out the tremendous work of our TBJ Board of Directors and all of our volunteers. Life Line Screening goes beyond regular checkups to look inside your arteries for signs of plague build-up



#### All 4 Screenings for \$149

#### Carotid Artery Disease:

An ultrasound is performed to screen the carotid arteries (a pair of blood vessels in the neck that deliver blood to your brain) for buildup of fatty plaque. This buildup, called atherosclerosis, is one of the leading causes of stroke.

An Ankle-Brachial Index (ABI) test is performed using blood pressure cuffs on the arms and leas. It is important to screen for PAD because it increases the risk of coronary artery disease, heart attack, or stroke.1

An ultrasound is performed to screen the abdominal aorta for the presence of an enlargement or aneurysm. AAA can lead to a ruptured aortic artery, stroke, and heart failure, which is a life-threatening medical emergency.

#### **Atrial Fibrillation:**

A 6-lead electrocardiogram (EKG) is performed by placing sensors on the arms and legs to screen for Atrial Fibrillation. AFib can lead to blood clots. and other heart-related complications.2
